Bosworth Beat Team

Our Bosworth Beat Team held a very successful Beat Surgery at The Gate Hangs Well on 11th March. PC Allan Charles and PCSO Tom Vaughan discussed many issues of concern including speeding, pavement parking, traveller occupation, anti-social behaviour, fly tipping, and police resources. The Local Beat is seeing an increase in anti-social behaviour (ASB) and officers have been working alongside H&BBC to identify those responsible and act as needed. If you are experiencing ASB please do report it. Whilst not necessarily criminal ASB affects the quality of life of our community and is taken seriously by the police. E-scooters are becoming a menace in some local areas, hopefully not Carlton. The police have reminded us that it is against the law to ride one on a public highway or pavement.

Vehicle theft is always a worry and the recent Carlton Beat Surgery highlighted two preventative measures:

- secure your number plates with tamper-resistant screws;
- hide keys from Keyless entry cars in a Faraday pouch.

Both these items may be available at low cost from the Police or NHW. If any residents wish to purchase, <u>please let me know</u> and I shall see if I can obtain them and distribute. The last Faraday pouches I obtained were just £2 each.

Carlton Charity Lands - Awards Increased to up to £300

Readers will be aware that Carlton Charity Lands has received very few applications in recent times. Indeed, you will recall a paper that was included in the February edition of Carlton News discussing the situation and asking Readers to make suggestions about how the Charity should move forward.

Unfortunately the Charity received a very limited response. Some suggestions were made that would see some funds distributed in areas other than the village. The current Governing Document sets the Charity's objectives as providing assistance to young people in the village and also assisting villagers who suffer with health problems.

After much deliberation, the Trustees decided that increasing the current £200 award to a maximum of £300 was appropriate given the number of young people who would be eligible to apply in the near future. To date, most awards have been to young people who were following an academic path. The Trustees decided that young people who were taking up apprenticeships or training in physical skills, e.g. plastering, should also be encouraged to apply.

Following a suggestion and given the Charity's remit in the area of health, the Trustees decided to make a donation of £250 to North West Leicestershire Community First Responders.

The Trustees next meet on 16 November and applications will be invited in due course.

Parish Council News

- Parish Council finance the PC's accounts for 2021-22 will be signed off at the meeting on 11th May, and will be published on the PC's website shortly afterwards. The accounts and supporting documentation will be open for public inspection from Monday 13th June to Friday 22nd July inclusive. In practice the Clerk is happy to answer questions about the accounts at any time.
- **Local Plan** the PC has submitted comments on the Draft Local Plan; the next stage of the process will be for the Draft to be submitted to the Secretary of State, and then examined at a public inquiry.
- **Churchyard wall** drainage has been installed behind the western part of the churchyard wall, and the area of the churchyard behind this wall, which was affected by the recent building works, has been cultivated and re-seeded by the Gardening Group.
- **Cemetery** the heap of soil from the path extension project has been levelled and seeded by the Gardening Group.
- **Carlton Green** the ditch around the west green has been cleaned out by the County Council Highways Team, together with the outfall into the ditch along the southern side of Congerstone Lane. The latter had become blocked, and surface water had backed up into the gullies in Shackerstone Walk creating a big puddle in the winter.
- **Footpath improvements** gates have been installed on the footpath between Back Lane and Harcourt Spinney in Market Bosworth thanks to County Councillor Bertie Harrison-Rushton and Mkt Bosworth PC. There is now only one stile (at the Stony Brook) on footpath S69 between Barton in the Beans and Market Bosworth.

Toddlers Play Area – the play bark will be topped up over the summer.

- **Platinum Jubilee Tree Planting** took place on 6th February. A report and photographs can be found on the *News* page of the PC website.
- **Water trough** an old concrete water trough has been moved from the Cemetery field to the highway verge at the eastern end of Main St and is being planted with flowers.

Crimes are best reported on-line at www.leics.police.uk/report-online. The alternative is to ring 101, but be aware that this service can be very slow. Individual officers can be contacted by voicemail by ringing 101 and then quoting their collar number.
