### Can we dig a hole in your garden?

#### WANTED - sites for small archaeological test pits

We are very excited to announce that Bosworth Links, our local Community Archaeology Project, has received £117,000 of funding from the National Lottery Heritage Fund. We are hoping to excavate archaeological test-pits in the villages of Carlton and Coton on Saturday 10<sup>th</sup> and Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> September this year. The test-pits are one metre square in size and up to one metre deep. They are excavated layer by layer, and the excavated soil is sieved for evidence of human activity. At the end of the weekend, all the soil is returned to the test-pit and any turf re-laid.

Test pitting provides a fascinating window into the past. Finds such as pottery and worked flint provide important evidence about the history of each site, and show how the village has grown and changed over time. We have previously dug test-pits in Market Bosworth with great success. ### Parish Plan 2021

The Parish Plan was launched at a public meeting in the Community Hub on 29<sup>th</sup> June, and the recommendations in the Plan were accepted by the Parish Council at a meeting on 13<sup>th</sup> July. The members of the Parish Plan group **were thanked** for their work in putting together this important document.

Following the PC meeting, some recommendations are already being taken forward:

- Requests for (i) a 20mph speed limit in the village, and (ii) an assessment of the Main St/Barton Rd junction have been submitted to the Highways & Transportation Department of the County Council;
- The replacement of two stiles by kissing gates on the footpath between the village and Lount Road has been put forward as a potential project for the Leicestershire County Council Members Highways Fund;
- New signs have been put up to encourage dog owners to clean up after their dogs;
- The speed indicator (SID) has been repaired and is now back in operation;
- Spring bulbs have been ordered for planting around the village this autumn.

### **Neighbourhood Watch Group**

There were 2 reported crimes in Carlton from March to May. These were public order and other theft. The latter crime means stealing from outside a home, often a garden or public space. #### **Bosworth Beat Team**

Colleagues from the Specialist Support Department with officers from the force's Road Policing Unit, Firearms teams and the neighbourhood response officers have been providing an overnight presence across the Beat recently. As well as prowling the area looking for anything out of place, they've been conducting proactive stop checks on vehicles and people that are roaming the streets in the early mornings. The Beat Team have been out on foot, speaking with the community and delivering items for crime prevention such as window vibration alarms to residents.

Items like vibration alarms, television light simulators and light timers prove a great deterrent to possible burglars. Please consider them especially as there has recently been a spate of burglaries in Stoke Golding. We've had lots of positive comments from residents whilst walking through the villages, with many people explaining the reassurance they feel when they see us about! If you see us walking about, please come over and say hello, talk to us about any issue or concerns that you have and we'll even get you signed up to our Neighbourhood Link service whilst we're at it!

The team continue to carry out traffic enforcement operations across the area with more planned. Anti-Social Behaviour Awareness Week was July 18-24. ASB is not a low level crime and is defined in the Crime and Disorder Act as acting 'in a manner that caused or was likely to cause harassment, alarm or distress to one or more persons not of the same household as the perpetrator. If you feel that you have or are being affected by ASB then do not hesitate to contact Leics police on 101 or 999 in emergencies.

By reporting anti-social behaviour you may prevent the same problem happening again and you will help make your community a safer place. We are very lucky in Carlton but by playing an active role in the community you can really help make a difference and create a place where anti-social behaviour is never tolerated.

#### **NHW National Update**

You wouldn't let a thief enter your home, but what if the thief was masquerading as someone familiar, such as a postman, and tricked you into opening the door? Phishing works in a similar way - criminals impersonate trusted organisations by creating legitimate-looking messages and websites to trick people into opening the doors to their personal

information. Once criminals have this information, it can be used to perpetrate fraud and cybercrime against you, or in your name. How big is the problem? It's massive.

Phishing attacks are a common problem faced by both individuals and businesses every single day. As of 31<sup>st</sup> May 2022, the National Cyber Security Centre's Suspicious Email Reporting Service (SERS) has received over 12 million reports from the public and has removed over 83,000 scams and 153,000 malicious websites.

#### The most impersonated

organisations in phishing emails reported last year were the NHS, HMRC and GOV.UK. Do not open or respond to emails from these organisations – they will contact you by letter if they need to reach you, never email. Most phone providers are part of a scheme that allows customers to report suspicious text messages for free by forwarding it to 7726. As of May 2022, 13,000 scams have been removed as a result of suspicious text messages reported using the 7726 service. Please use this and help us all.

## **Church News**

After many years' service as Church Warden Bill Sharp has retired. At the last meeting of the Parochial Church Council, Bill was presented with a gift voucher by Murray Lockwood and thanked for his hard work in helping to ensure the smooth running of the church for more than 30 years. The role of Church Warden is an ancient one and carries

legal responsibilities within the church. Murray Lockwood continues to serve as a Church Warden and all matters relating to church business should be referred to him.

### **Parish Council News**

- **Parish Council finance** no objections were made to the PC's accounts for 2021-22, and the annual audit is now complete. In practice the Clerk is happy to answer questions about the accounts at any time.
- **Toddlers Play Area** the play bark has been topped up, with the help of a grant from the Borough Council.
- Water trough planter at the east end of Main Street is maturing well, thanks to the local volunteers who keep it watered and free from weeds. We are investigating the possibility of adding another trough in this area.

**Spring bulbs** - will be planted in the Jubilee Orchard and around the village this autumn.

- Parish Boundary the PC has suggested that the Parish boundary might be adjusted so that it does not pass through gardens or houses, and so that Park View Farm on Bosworth Road will be in the Parish of Carlton instead of Market Bosworth.
- **Church gate** is being examined to see whether it can be sympathetically repaired, as it is made of wrought iron with blacksmith's joints. The arch above the gateway once housed an oil lamp, and it has been suggested that a replica lamp might be made to fit the existing bracket.
