Call for Applications

The Trustees of Carlton Charity Lands had to conduct the business of their November meeting by email owing to the Coronavirus restrictions. Five applications were received and each one was awarded the maximum grant of £200.

On March 17th 2021, the Trustees will hold their next meeting. Applications for an award must be received by March 3rd 2021.

If you are, or you know of, a young person aged from 16 to 23 years, who is in, or planning to go into further or higher education, or training and would benefit from the Charity Lands' help then please encourage them to apply. Grants are made to help with the costs of apprenticeships, buying books, equipment, fees, travel costs and starting a business. Retrospective applications will be considered for expenditure that has been incurred since the Trustees' previous meeting, in this case, 18th November 2020.

Carlton Charity Lands distributes the annual rental income from two fields in the parish of Carlton in the form of financial assistance to young people at the early stages of their careers.

Successful applicants must provide proof of purchase or costs incurred before monies are released. When an award is made, the applicant may not apply for another award until twelve months have elapsed from the date of the initial award.

Carlton Parish Plan 2021

The current members of the Carlton Parish Plan Group are Robin Arnold, Mandie Bristlin, Enid Morgan, Chris Peat, Carol Piggon, Clare Roscoe, Ken Salisbury, Ian Sarson, Mick Vann and Robin Williams. If you would like to join this Group, or suggest issues that it might address, please contact any of the above.

The starting point for updating the Parish Plan is to look back over the ten years since the last Plan was published, to see what has been achieved.

To begin with, the Carlton Diamond Jubilee Orchard has been created, linking Barton Road to Nailstone Road with a safe footpath, and including a picnic table, seats and an equipped play area for toddlers. Oak trees have also been planted along local roads, to enhance the countryside setting of Carlton, absorb carbon and to provide shade as the climate warms.

The specific short-term objectives of the 2011 Parish Plan have largely been realised – the affordable housing project has been completed, improving Nailstone Road, regular coffee mornings are being held, local footpaths have been improved, and traffic speeds are being monitored. The pub and church have been supported, informal walking and cycling groups have been formed, several Facebook groups have been created and the Neighbourhood Watch scheme has been expanded. Local businesses have been supported, while ensuring that their activities will not affect their neighbours or intrude into open countryside.

The medium to long-term objectives included making improvements to the church building, currently a major project being brought forward by the Parochial Church Council, which will create a community hub and activity space, and help to ensure the long-term viability of this listed building. Other objectives have not been forgotten, and representations have been made and money set aside to bring schemes forward, if and when opportunities should arise.

It is now time to reassess our community, to decide what things are most important to us, and to look forward and generate proposals for making Carlton an even better place to live.

If you wish to report a crime, but you don't want to identify yourself, contact Crimestoppers. They'll ask questions about the crime but not about you. If you're concerned your call could be traced, dial 141 before 0800 555 111, this will block your phone number.

NHW National Update

Cyber crime

Criminals are taking advantage of the Covid-19 vaccine rollout through a convincing Scam text to steal people's personal and financial details. The text contains a link that leads to a convincing fake NHS website with an application form. It asks for your bank / card details in order to 'check identity'. The NHS will never ask for payment. Please warn friends and family of this scam text.

If you believe you, or your family or friend are the victim of a fraud, please report this to Action Fraud as soon as possible by calling 0300-123 -2040 or visiting www.actionfraud.police.uk

Romance Fraud

This happens when the victim thinks they've met the perfect partner through an online dating website or app, but the other person is using a fake profile to form a relationship with them. They use the site to gain the victim's trust and ask them for money or enough personal information to steal their identity. Romance fraudsters are masters of manipulation and will go to great lengths to create a false reality in which an individual feels that they are making rational decisions. The challenge for family and friends of those affected by romance fraud is being able to disrupt the false reality created to enable them

to see the situation for what it really is – a fraud. It's so important that if you feel you, or a friend, have fallen victim to a romance fraudster that you seek help by reaching out to Action Fraud 0300 123 2040 or Victim Support 0808 168 9111.

NHW Crime and Community Survey 2020

This had over 30,000 respondents across England and Wales. The purpose was to better understand the impact of NHW on:

- levels of crime victimisation
- fear of crime and feelings of safety
- neighbourliness, community cohesion and isolation
- and to better understand the current reach and diversity of NHW.

Building St Andrew's Community Hub

First, may I start by wishing you and your families a much better and brighter 2021. And I have great news. We now have identified just over £200,000 of funding and are about £40,000 away from being able to start the building work on our Community Hub. My particular thanks this time go to Simon Cooper, Bill Sharp, Mick Vann and Chris Peat for volunteering to gather donations from our 'Buy a Brick' campaign. My thanks, too, to all of you who have donated so far. I have put up some leaflets around Carlton on Buy a Brick, though I and our volunteers would be happy to answer any questions you may have. I will also update the Funding Thermometer on the parish noticeboard outside St Andrew's as we get closer to our funding target.

Sadly, there is still mixed news on funding from charitable organisations. As sources of funding are dwindling because Covid projects are being prioritised by many and, as I understand it, a lack of return on their investments, many charities no longer have any funds to give out. However, the better news is that at the end of November we received a large donation from the Bernard Sunley Foundation to help us achieve the £200,000 milestone.

At this critical stage of our project, we would be very grateful if you decided to support the development of our Hub by making a donation to the project, either through Buy a Brick or direct to our charity, the Friends of St Andrew's. In either case I would be happy to pass your donation on.

Cemetery paths – there are plans to repair and extend the cemetery paths next summer, subject to grant approval.

Diamond Jubilee Orchard – the hedge along the northern side of the Orchard is to be laid next Autumn.

Toddlers Play Area – the play bark will be topped up in the Spring.

Carlton Gate – an information board has been designed and will be installed in the garden of The Gate Hangs Well in the summer, subject to grant approval.

Budget – the Parish Council's budget for 2021-22 can be found on the PC's website. The PC element of the Band D Council Tax is expected to be £47.65.

Churchyard wall – bulges out towards the road when the weather has been wet and moves back when the ground dries out. Measurements are being made every three months – a recent summary is in Report 2020-18 on the PC website.

Speed and traffic monitoring

Our speed indicator device (SID) monitored southbound vehicles on Barton Road between 4th October and 2nd November. During this period 10,219 vehicles were counted: the average number was 358/day on weekdays, and 342/day over the week as a whole. The average speed was 28.3 mph and the 85th percentile speed 35.9 mph. The highest speed recorded was 55.0 mph at 15:55 hrs on 15th October.

From 4th November to 30th November the SID monitored westbound vehicles in Main Street near Carlton Green. During this period 14,320 vehicles were counted: the average number was 615/day on weekdays, and 532/day over the week as a whole. The average speed was 23.8 mph and the 85th percentile speed 30.2 mph. The highest speed recorded was 55.0 mph at 23:40 hrs on 24th November.

The street lighting columns on which the SID is fixed have to be structurally tested every two years or so. The testing has just been carried out – at a cost of £479 – and the SID will be re-deployed as soon as the relevant licence has been issued by the Highway Authority.
