These roads are intended to link each settlement to the trunk road network, and drivers are advised to use them in icy or snowy conditions. Nailstone Road and Bufton Lane – Lount Road are not gritted.

Neighbourhood Watch

There were 3 reported crimes in Carlton from September to November 2023. These were 1 burglary, 1 other theft and 1 violence and/sexual assault. Bosworth Beat Team

Every winter the Police receive reports of stolen vehicles as a result of owners leaving them unattended while they warm up. Don't forget to stay with your car whilst de-icing your windscreen to avoid opportunistic thieves stealing it!

A Speed Operation was recently conducted over 2 days in local villages. Several vehicles were stopped and speed limits highlighted. Educating and raising awareness of the dangers of speeding is a continued priority as part of **Leicestershire Police's Fatal Four Traffic Operation** designed to combat four of the biggest contributors to driving fatalities: speeding, drink driving, mobile phone usage and driving without seat belts.

Patrols have been carried out across the beat at school times due to ongoing issues relating to parking. Pedestrian safety is paramount and drivers are urged not to block the pavement or any road. If your vehicle is found to be blocking the pavement it may be seized for obstruction. Although there aren't any schools in Carlton please be mindful of this and also make sure any contractors/couriers at your property do not block pavements. Thanks!

Leicestershire Police recently shared a request on Neighbourhood Link for any CCTV or RingGo doorbell footage to help with a local crime. If you want to receive updates via Neighbourhood Link, please visit <u>www.neighbourhoodlink.co.uk</u> to register yourselves. This is an easy, free email messaging service from Leicestershire Police and local partner organisations, providing news on policing matters that may be relevant to you and where you may be able to help.

Crime in Carlton is thankfully low, but if you are unfortunate enough to be a victim please report to Leicestershire Police. Use 999 in an emergency or 101 / online for anything else. Bank scams are very popular and a huge area of fraud. If you think someone is trying to trick you into handing over money, cards or personal details - **Stop, Hang Up and Call 159** to speak directly to your bank. 159 works in the same way as 101 for the police or 111 for the NHS. It's the number you can trust to get you through to your bank safely and securely, every time.

159 was launched in 2021 to provide a memorable simple way to connect UK banking customers securely with their bank if they receive a suspicious call about a financial matter. It breaks the scam 'journey' at the critical moment when you are at most risk of being manipulated into making a payment. So, even if scammers can contact you, that link will be broken by your call to 159, before any information is shared, any payment is made, and any harm is done. 16 major UK banks and building societies subscribe to 159 so it reaches most customers. If you think someone is trying to trick you into handing over money or personal details - stop, hang up and call 159 to speak directly to your bank. And if you can't remember the number just think of the bus that used to run through Carlton until 2 years ago.....!

Council tax – the PC has issued a precept of £9,200 for 2024-25, which will mean that the element of the Band D Council tax payable to the PC will increase from £47.61 to £50.86. The PC's budget can be found on the website.

- Fly tipping nine chemical drums containing an unidentified liquid and marked 'hazardous' were dumped in the ditch along Congerstone Lane in early December. This dumping has to be collected by a specialist contractor, and the drums were still in place on 21st January when this piece was written. The PC has complained that the current system of dealing with fly tipping means that dangerous materials are left in public places for long periods.
- **Churchyard wall** the eastern part of the wall has a bulge in the middle and is leaning towards the road, and has now been monitored for 4 years. In the winter when the weather is wet the wall is pushed over by expansion of the clay behind it, but in summer it moves back again. Last November, after a very wet autumn, the deviation from the vertical was 99mm which is the maximum observed so far.
- **Cemetery fence** was pushed over by sheep in December, but fortunately the sheep were spotted in the churchyard before they had nibbled any trees or flowers. Most of the fenceposts were found to be rotten, and both of the fences are to be replaced.
- **Carlton Gardening Group** has been awarded a *Thriving Level 4* award by the Royal Horticultural Society and Britain in Bloom *It's Your Neighbourhood* Scheme for its work in the Diamond Jubilee Orchard.
- Speed and traffic monitoring the Speed Indicator Device (SID) was deployed in Nailstone Road in December, checking the speed of vehicles entering the village. 17,606 vehicles were monitored, an average of 910 per day, with an average speed of 27.9 mph and an 85th percentile speed of 34.4 mph. Full details and a chart can be found on the Traffic and Speed Monitoring page of the PC website. The Police have been asked to carry out speed checks in the village.

Crimes are best reported on-line at www.leics.police.uk/report-online. The alternative is to ring 101, but be aware that this service can be very slow. Individual officers can be contacted by voicemail by ringing 101 and then quoting their collar number.
