Church lamp

The Parish Council has installed a new lamp above the churchyard gate. It was made by Michael Clamp of Snarestone, and is solar powered so comes on when someone walks under it after dusk. This project was supported by a generous grant from the Jack Patston Trust.

There was originally an oil lamp which fitted into the square holder in the arch above the gate, but this disappeared many years ago. The wrought iron arch probably dates from 1867 when the church building



was altered and the saddleback top was added to the tower. The new lamp fits into the same holder and is of a simple design to complement the original arch and the church building.

Neighbourhood Watch

There was just one reported crime in Carlton in the three months September to November 2024. This was an offence of public order in November. Other surrounding villages have experienced vehicle crime recently but not Carlton, which is good news. Please keep up simple security measures and vigilance for yourselves and neighbours to keep the figures low. During December local police took part in a week of enforcement against the supply of drugs and County Lines. Cars and premises were searched across the area with some fantastic results. Most of the leads came as a result of information from the community so if you suspect someone is up to no good then report it to Leics Police via the online portal https://www.leics.police.uk/report-online by calling 101 or by calling CrimeStoppers anonymously on **0800 555 111**.

Statistics for the drug enforcement week were addresses searched 13, vehicles searched 5, people searched 18. The drugs found included large amounts of crack cocaine, heroin, cocaine, cannabis and amphetamine. In addition over £15,000 of cash was seized. The week also include drug workshops and engagement at schools, children's homes, youth centres and the night economy to highlight the risks of exploitation and raise awareness.

Fraud is currently the most prevalent crime in England and Wales accounting for 40% of all crimes in 2024. Last year retail and consumer fraud increased by 19%. Fraudsters are becoming more sophisticated, cloning websites of major retailers or travel companies to get us to part with our money so use double check before you buy online and always take care buying from pop-up sites - which may be fake.

Data is valuable so protect your personal details:

- Don't use the same password across different accounts
- Create strong passwords and use a reputable password manager
- Download antivirus software on your devices
- Set up two-factor authentication (2FA) or two-step verification (2SV). This is when you
 provide a separate form of identification, such as a code being sent via text, when you
 log into an account

To report a crime or suspicious activity call **101** (Leicestershire Police). In an emergency, with a crime in progress, call 999. For any fraud or cyber scams Action Fraud is on **0300 123 2040.**

Main Street – will be closed on 14th March to allow Severn Trent Water to repair a manhole.

Council Tax 2025-26 — the Parish Council receives most of its funding from the Council Tax. In 2024-25 the element of the Band D Council Tax paid to the Parish Council was £50.86 per property. In 2025-26 this will increase to £57.05, an increase of £6.19pa or 52p/month. Detailed information about the Parish Council's budget and finances can be found here— www.carltonpc.co.uk/finance.

Internal Auditor – Mrs D Igoe has been appointed Internal Auditor for 2025-26.

Toddlers Play Equipment – rot has been found to be developing in one of the swing supports. The timber is under guarantee, and this has been referred to the manufacturer. The equipment is still safe to use.

Church gate – is to be repaired.

Speeding traffic – the Road Safety Unit has carried out a speed survey on Bosworth/Barton Roads and has highlighted concerns to the Police Traffic Management Dept and County Council Highways Dept. This may result in a visit by the speed enforcement van.

Speed and traffic monitoring

The Speed Indicator Device (SID) was deployed in Bosworth Road in September/October, checking the speed of vehicles entering the village. Although the SID recorded 25,320 vehicles, at least 4,936 counts were false, being caused by blown rain. Selected data (13,483 counts) showed average speeds of 32.9mph and an 85th percentile speed of 43.3mph.

In October/November the SID was sited in Barton Road, checking the speed of southbound vehicles entering the village. 9,022 vehicles were monitored, an average of 313/day. The average speed was 31.2mph and the 85th percentile speed 37.6mph.

In November/December the SID was moved to the western part of Main Street, checking the speed of eastbound vehicles entering the village. 23,955 vehicles were monitored, an average of 834/day with an average speed of 20.6mph and an 85th percentile speed of 28.2mph.

Dial 999 and ask for Police, Fire or Ambulance if there is immediate danger or a crime is being committed. If a cardiac arrest is suspected the ambulance service will give you the code to access the community defibrillator. Ring 05603-680-268 for a volunteer to bring the community defibrillator to you.

Crimes are best reported on-line at www.leics.police.uk/report-online. The alternative is to ring 101, but be aware that this service can be very slow. Individual officers can be contacted by voicemail by ringing 101 and then quoting their collar number.
