Speed and traffic monitoring

The Speed Indicator Device (SID) was deployed in the middle of Main Street (eastbound) in January, and showed an average speed of 26.2 mph and an 85th percentile speed of 32.7 mph.

In March the SID was moved to the western end of Main Street (westbound), and showed an average speed of 26.9 mph and an 85th percentile speed of 32.8 mph.

In April the SID monitored southbound traffic on Nailstone Road, and showed an average speed of 30.8mph and an 85th percentile speed of 36.9 mph.



Theodora Salusbury

A green plaque honouring the achievements of Theodora Salusbury, the Arts & Crafts stained glass artist has been installed at the church of St James the Greater in Birstall.



Theodora Salusbury attended the Leicester School of Art and the Slade School of Fine Art before training with Christopher Whall and then setting up her own studio in St Agnes in Cornwall. She used high quality glass slabs that produced the brilliant colours for which she became renowned.

Some of her windows, including the one in St Andrew's Church, bear her signature of a small peacock which she chose because it is a symbol of

resurrection. She made windows for nearly 30 churches in England and Wales, including Narborough, Newtown Linford, Queniborough, Kimcote and Woodhouse Eaves in Leicestershire.

St Andrew's Bells

It was thought for a long time that the bells in our church would never ring again due to rot in the timber, but a recent survey shows with a bit of work they could be made to ring again. Of all the churches in our diocese only 10% have bells that can ring: most are too far gone or have been removed - the Carlton bells are the only ones left that are capable of being saved.

Village churches can only survive these days if they are multi-functional, so the building needs to be a church and a village hall. Having bells ringing again would be a big asset, not only preserving the original integrity of the building but allowing it to be used by the village for other activities. I have submitted a report to the PCC and the Friends of St Andrews charity with the hope that this will be supported.

I hope this answers all the questions that some parishioners asked me about some time ago.

NHW National Update

Personal details are big business in crime. Criminals are targeting WhatsApp users by posing as a friend and asking for a security code. The scam begins when a criminal gets access to another WhatsApp account which has you listed as a contact.

The criminal, posing as your friend or contact will then send you seemingly normal messages to try and start a conversation with you. Around the same time you will receive a text message from WhatsApp with a six-digit code. This is because the criminal has been trying to login to WhatsApp using your mobile number. The criminal will claim that they sent you their code by accident and ask you to help them by sending it to them. Once the criminal has this code, they can login to your WhatsApp account and lock you out. The criminal will then use the same tactic with your WhatsApp contacts in an effort to steal more accounts and use them to perpetrate fraud.

What you need to do:

- Set up two-step verification to give an extra layer of protection to your account: Tap Settings > Account >Two-step verification > Enable.
- Think and Call. If a family member or friend makes an unusual request on WhatsApp, or the style doesn't sound right, always call the person to confirm their identity. Do not engage with the messenger.
- Never share your account's activation code (that's the 6-digit code you receive via SMS)
- You can report spam messages or block a sender within WhatsApp. Press and hold on the message bubble, select 'Report' and then follow the instructions.

If you have been a victim of fraud or cybercrime, report it to <u>Action Fraud</u> or 0300 123 2040.

Please do not park on pavements

- doing so could force a vulnerable pedestrian onto the road.

This is simply a matter of common sense and courtesy for those around us. The bottom line is that **IT IS AN OFFENCE** to drive on a pavement and **IT IS AN OFFENCE** to block pedestrian access on a pavement.

Parish Council News

- **Coronation** three sessile oak whips (*Quercus petraea*) have been planted to mark the Coronation, one at Harry's Grave and two in the Jubilee Orchard. A member of the original Carlton Brownie Pack has been invited to plant a Fang's hornbeam (*Carpinus fangiana*) in the churchyard.
- Shackerstone Walk attempts to jet the drain clear have failed: the pipe under Congerstone Lane has probably collapsed and the road will have to be dug up by the Highway Authority.
- **Kissing gates** 12 new kissing gates have been installed around Carlton, thanks to the LCC Members Highways Fund. An article about this project has been submitted to Aspect and The Graphic for publication after the election.
- Toddlers Play Area the playbark will be topped up this summer.
- **Bosworth Marina** tree planting has at last been carried out on the Marina site, some nine years after it opened, and in response to the threat of enforcement action.
- Audit the Parish Council's accounts for 2022-23 will be examined and (hopefully) approved at the PC meeting on 17th May. Summaries will then be posted on the Parish Council website. The accounts and supporting documentation will be available for public inspection from Monday 5th June to Friday 14th July inclusive. This is a legal requirement: in practice I am happy to discuss the accounts at any time.
