Carlton Open Gardens, Sunday 1st June

On Sunday 1st June six very different and interesting gardens will be open to the public in Carlton from 10.30am - 4.30pm for the NGS (National Garden Scheme). The gardens are at 64 Main St, Bumble Cot, Drovers Barn, Hillsdon, Home Farm House and Woodmill.

Tickets will be on sale at the church on the day and at participating gardens. The £6 ticket allows entry to all six gardens, children under 16 go free.

Teas and cakes will be on sale at the church and locally grown plants will be available to buy at Home Farm House.

This is the third time in recent years that Carlton has hosted NGS open gardens, but the first time we have opened in June. This time you can look forward to seeing peonies, delphiniums and roses in full bloom and visiting a new garden.

You can enjoy that cuppa and lemon drizzle cake knowing that your contribution is going to charity.

80% of this year's profits from teas and plant sales is split equally between St Andrew's and the Friends of St Andrew's. 20% will go to NGS along with 100% of the entry ticket sales. In 2024 NGS raised a staggering £3.5 million nationally for well known charities including Marie Curie, MacMillan Cancer Support and Hospice UK. Leicestershire raised £90,000. Now is the time to start growing your flowers and vegetables for exhibition.

This year the show will be held in a marquee at The Rectory. **Please note that staging will be at the earlier time of 9-10.30am.** Entries cost 50p, first prize £2.

There will be four classes for young people – a colouring competition for those under 10 years old, and competitions for the tallest runner bean plant, a decorated stone or pebble and five decorated cupcakes for everyone under 18 years old. Other sections are open to all ages:

Flowers - a vase of garden flowers, a specimen flower, three flowers of one variety and an indoor pot plant.

33rd Carlton Litter Pick 16 March 2025

Three young people and 18 adults participated this year, and we were able to cover all the roads leading to our neighbouring villages.

This year there was an exceptional number of glass bottles in the ditches and hedgerows, particularly in Lount Road and Bosworth Road. Car debris from recent floods and hedgerow accidents included front wing pieces, wheel trims and number plates. There was also a nice variety of 'miscellaneous items', including two pairs of trainers, a greenhouse heater, catering size squeezy cream cannisters, and three car tyres. Prizes were awarded as usual for the most useful, the most interesting, and the most decorative finds. There were no entries for the most disgusting item this year.

We thank the Hinckley and Bosworth Borough Council Clean Neighbourhoods Team for the loan of equipment and for disposing of all the rubbish collected.

Neighbourhood Watch

There were 11 reported crimes in Carlton in the three months December 2024 to February 2025. These were violence and/or sexual assault (6), anti-social behaviour (2), public order (1) and criminal damage and/or arson (2). These figures mirror national trends where violence and/or sexual assault continues to account for nearly 40% of reported crime. We have around 80 e-mail addresses on the Carlton NHW circulation. Market Bosworth Beat Team

The team's priorities are anti-social behaviour, road safety and rural crime including burglary. Listening to community concerns is at the very core of what we do in Neighbourhood Policing. We rely on members of the public telling us what's happening so as that we can act and prioritise our patrols. As well as relying on your reporting to us for information gathering, we seek all opportunities to engage with members of the public at locally advertised events. To report a crime or suspicious activity contact Leicestershire Police call via the online portal www.leics.police.uk/report-online, or by calling 101.

In an emergency, with a crime in progress, **call 999**. For any fraud or cyber scams Action Fraud is on **0300 123 2040**.

To report a crime or suspicious behaviour anonymously you can call Crimestoppers on **0800 555 111**.

Two men were recently arrested following a burglary in Market Bosworth where a vehicle was taken. Upon being disturbed by neighbours they abandoned some of their loot and made off in the stolen vehicle. Unfortunately for them the vehicle contained an electrical tracker. Warwickshire Officers tracked the pair and after a short chase through a field they were promptly arrested. Enquiries are ongoing about further offences in the area. Burglary and vehicle crime is fairly rare in Carlton but do consider a tracker if you have a vehicle that would appeal to thieves. And, as this case shows, a neighbour's intervention can be very helpful in catching criminals.

Parish Council News

- **Shackerstone Walk** will be closed on 2nd June to allow LCC Highways to repair the damaged drain which has given rise to flooding over the past two years.
- **Accounts** The Parish Council's accounts and supporting documentation will be available for inspection from 3rd June to 14th July 2025. In practice most financial information is published on the PC website, and I am happy to answer questions about the accounts at any time.
- **Noticeboard** A new noticeboard has been installed near the Main Street/Barton Road junction.
- **Church Gate** –This has been repaired and now closes properly. Volunteers from Market Bosworth Rotary Club have kindly offered to clean it up and repaint it.
- **Diamond Jubilee Orchard** has been entered into the 2025 Royal Horticultural Society's *It's Your Neighbourhood* scheme.
- Miles without stiles More stiles have been replaced by kissing gates: the stile on footpath S78 at the western boundary of Westfields Farm; the stile next to the footbridge over Carlton Brook near Harcourt Mill; the stile at the southern end of the jitty opposite the church gate in Nailstone. We thank local landowners, the Parish Councils concerned, the County Council Rights of Way Team and Hinckley & Bosworth Borough Council for their support.

Speed and traffic monitoring

The Speed Indicator Device (SID) was deployed in Bosworth Road in January, checking the speed of northbound vehicles entering the village. 15,494 vehicles were monitored, an average of 567/day with an average speed of 34mph and an 85th percentile speed of 42.3mph.

In February the SID was sited in Barton Road, checking the speed of northbound vehicles leaving the village. 23,234 vehicles were monitored, an average of 857/day. The average speed was 21mph and the 85th percentile speed 29.6mph, but the counts were artificially high and the speeds artificially low because of false counts due to bad weather.

The intention of these two sets of counts was to monitor the speed of northbound vehicles passing through the village along Bosworth and Barton Roads. Full details of this exercise can be found in the report dated 17.2.25 on the PC website.

In March the SID was moved to Nailstone Road, checking the speed of southbound vehicles. 24,118 vehicles were monitored, an average of 851/day with an average speed of 30.3mph and an 85th percentile speed of 36.3mph.

Dial 999 and ask for Police, Fire or Ambulance if there is immediate danger or a crime is being committed. If a cardiac arrest is suspected the ambulance service will give you the code to access the community defibrillator. Ring 05603-680-268 for a volunteer to bring the community defibrillator to you.

Crimes are best reported on-line at www.leics.police.uk/report-online. The alternative is to ring 101, but be aware that this service can be very slow. Individual officers can be contacted by voicemail by ringing 101 and then quoting their collar number.
